There are hundreds of glasses frames on the shelves - clear glasses and sunglasses, glasses for men, women and kids. There are thick frames and metal frames. Serious and whimsical. But if you still can't find that perfect look, there are thousands more in a virtual store that can be accessed from home.

They are all in a new business to the

this didn't include the reduction anticipated with air conditioning during the summer months. The photos below show the existing equipment that has been in the building since it was first built, consisting of a large inefficient fan motor and individual duct heaters in branching ductwork to various rooms and areas of the building. Since this equipment has been in service since construction, it's not hard to believe its efficiencies are much lower than that of the new equipment being installed.

Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio, SEER rating, has greatly in systems the past years. This measures an air conditioning system's efficiencies by calculating the cooling output divided by the amount of electric energy input. The higher the SEER rating, the greater energy efficiency of your air conditioning system.

When estimating a building commercial lighting consumption,

1.5 Watts per square foot is used. Since the North Itasca Electric building has 15,488 square feet, calculations would come to 23 kW per hour. With lights being on 9 hours per day, 22 days per month, energy use for lighting is 4,554 kWh per month. Since there is minimal other equipment in the building, even adding 2,000 kWh for it shows 6,554 kWh out of the 13,200 kWh per month as a baseline leaving 6,646 kWh for air conditioning. I can see these units using much less than 6,646 kWh for air conditioning.

I'm looking forward to comparing the numbers to past consumptions. When up and running, I will keep you posted on the results.





glasses from opthalmologists and optometrists, fitting glasses with accurate measurements and frame choices from the customer.

He has some stiff competition from online sites and optical shops tied to eye doctors. Often patients don't realize that they can fill prescriptions at a different location. However in 1978, a federal law required a prescription release right in the doctor's office after an eye exam.

When a prescription is brought to him, he will walk the customer through the order of frames and lenses. Too often, he points out, a new bifocal user will hear "You'll get used to them." understanding how they work, and what they can and cannot do gives a new user a much better experience.

Frames in his shop typically run half to 2/3 the cost of optical shops, costing \$59, \$79 or \$99. In addition, Mark subscribes to a remarkable computer app where any of his supplier Modern Optical's frames can be placed on the customer's own image to see what they look

like.

Lenses come from a lab in Iowa. Over the years, he points out, he has had the opportunity to interact with all the frame companies and labs in the U.S. and trusts this lab to have a good product at a good price.

Mark's career started in the Service. With a low draft number, he enlisted in the Army during the Viet Nam War. That gave him the opportunity to pick a trade, and he chose optical technician.

It provided vocational education and hands-on training - actually making glasses for the Army and Air Force. When he left the service he pursued another year of vocational training in Anoka and later a year in sales and marketing in Thief River Falls where he managed a Midwest Vision Center. He pursued his career in the Twin Cities and St. Cloud and also spent time in Hayward, Wis., returning for family reasons to Roseau before retiring. Throughout his career he gained experience in wholesale, retail, direct customer care and management.

That's another reason to try



Bigfork hears about e2ip

At its April 12 meeting, the Bigfork City Council was updated on the status of the e2ip (Bergquist) building sale north of the city and heard about a Job Fair scheduled for May 5.

Apreviously interested business, Lakeshirts, has placed the e2ip building purchase on hold, however Itasca Economic Development Corporation CEO Tamara Lowney said that Itasca County is supportive of using American Rescue Plan (ARP) funding to allow the IEDC to purchase and maintain the building to keep it on the market for sale or a possible lease. Lowney requested city participation to show community support such as lawn care.

The council continued its discussion of a SCADA system installation for the water and sewer systems, and will use ARP funds to pay for a monitoring system when chosen, with the remaining funds to be allocated to the Water Tower Project. The council also appointed Public Works Director Joe Zimmer as Wellhead Protection Manager.

The council approved a Memorial Day Parade request from Michele Carnahan on behalf of the Bigfork Elementary fifth grade class on Friday, May 27, starting at 1 p.m. The parade will travel between the Wanigan park at the north end of Bigfork to the Bigfork Veterans Memorial Park.

The next regular meeting of the Bigfork City Council will be on Tuesday, May 10 at 9:30 a.m. at the Edge Center.

May 5: Job Fair for EOW communities

When Bigfork applied for funding to redo the road to the Rajala Mill in Bigfork, part of the expectation was that the project would create new jobs.

The road is complete. But what happened was that the jobs are there, but the people aren't.

It was a surprising development, and several businesses and organizations - the hospital, school, logging industry and city - got together to talk about what turned out to be a common issue.

"We have a lot of quality employment opportunities in the Edge of the Wilderness area," said Bigfork Mayor Bryan Boone. Now the challenge is to match those jobs with job seekers.

Things have changed in the workplace, he pointed out. Gas prices are going up. Personal lives are changing and businesses are more interested in working with people to find the right situation for them.

"Our preference is to have our people doing our stuff," he said. For instance, a parent might be able to find part-time work if it was close to home. People currently commuting might find it's just as viable to work close to home, saving gas and all those minutes that they could be spending with family.

Job seekers might also find that wages have increased since the last time they looked.

The group decided to put on a Job Fair showcasing opportunities to residents of the Edge of the Wilderness area. It will be held Thursday, May 5 at the Bigfork City Hall from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 4-6 p.m. In addition, Bigfork High School students will be visiting the Fair during the afternoon to see what local career path opportunities there are, and the prerequisites they need to complete.

Businesses can participate with sponsorships ranging from \$20 to \$300, and the event will be publicized with mailings, posters and a Facebook page that will carry job listings. All funds collected will go to promote and stage the event, said Boone.
